We pay our respects to Elders past, present and emerging and recognise the wisdom in Traditional practices and how this continues to protect country.


We acknowledge that sovereignty was never ceded, and it 'Always Was, Always Will Be - Aboriginal Land'.


Mapiloj actic ILLUSTRATIONS
