

Total Humanitarian Youth Arrivals 2019-20 Financial Year*

The granting of offshore Humanitarian visas was suspended in March 2020 as part of the Australian Government's COVID-19 response. This resulted in smaller numbers of arrivals than in previous years, however in the 2019-20 financial year, young people continued to make up a significant proportion of arrivals through Australia's Humanitarian Program.


State/Territory Arrivals Breakdown


